This year, more than 281,550 women and 2,650 men will be diagnosed with breast cancer, and 43,600 women and 530 men will die from the disease in the United States. To help bring attention to this issue and make an impact in the fight, the International Union, UAW Women's Department is partnering with the American Cancer Society Making Strides Against Breast Cancer for the 9th consecutive year.

Together, we can make an impact on this disease and help the American Cancer Society save more lives from breast cancer. Since 2014, UAW and our members have fundraised a total of \$583,050
