REGION 8 LOCAL VETERANS COMMITTEE REPORT JULY-SEPTEMBER 2025

The biggest thing to happen this quarter was the two conferences, the 2025 National Veterans Conference and the 2025 Region 8 Standing Committee Conference. Even though the Conferences were concurrent, the Region 8 Veteran Committees were able to send a total of 58 delegates combined. Several small Locals were able to take advantage of the Region 8 Scholarships for Black Lake. The delegates really enjoyed the changes made to the curriculum at the 2025 National Veterans Conference. The Region 8 Standing Committee Conference had several guest speakers from the Florida Department of Veterans Affairs, to include Bay Pines Veterans Outreach, as well as the availability of Veteran Service Officers. There was also an election of Officers. The current Region 8 National Veterans Advisory Council remained intact.

Many of the newly appointed Local Veterans Committee Chairs were able to attend one of the two Conferences. They had the opportunity to network with other Chairs to get some ideas, particularly concerning fundraising and volunteer opportunities. Some have already been able to increase the number of people on their Committee.

Local 129 (Grand Prairie, TX)

- * The new Veterans Committee Chair is in place. He has set up some visions and goals for his Committee:
- * 1) Canvas the membership to increase the number of people on the Veterans Committee. Make sure the members have volunteer opportunities available so that they can be active in the Committee.
- * 2) Find out what resources are available in the community for Veterans. Set up opportunities to use these resources to help the Veterans become more knowledgeable of their benefits, to include how to open a VA claim.

- * 4) Network with Chairs of other Local Veteran Committees to get ideas on volunteer opportunities and fundraising. Become familiar with the rules regarding fundraising.
- * 5) Set realistic and achievable goals for myself and the Committee. Grow the Committee together.

Local 276 (Grand Prairie, TX)

- * The Veterans Committee was able to go forward with their postponed Veterans Celebration Comedy Show. To show their appreciation, it was free to all Veterans in the plant. Money that was raised went back into the budget (\$1420).
- * The following month the Committee meet to discuss past events and plan future ones.
- * Roy Davis was appointed as the new Co-Chair of the Committee, a vacancy that occurred when DeShaun Spencer was appointed the Chair of the Veterans Committee.

Local 862 (Louisville, KY)

- * The Veterans Committee voted to purchase eleven new Air Soft Rifles for the Active Heroes Veterans Retreat in Shepherdsville, KY. It was approved by the E-Board. The Veterans Committee meeting was held at the Retreat. Lunch was catered by Mission Barbecue, a Veteran owned business.
- * The Committee was able to send a total of 13 members to the two Veterans conferences this year. The new format of the 2025 National Veterans Conference was very much appreciated. Signing up for the classes was a smooth process.
- * The members participated in the final Bluegrass Honor Flight of the year. We helped the Veterans who were handicapped/disabled get out if their vehicles and into wheelchairs. They were helped inside the airport and were checked in. Upon their return, a "Welcome Home" inside the airport awaited them.
- * Coozies were ordered for the Committee members, as well as having them as a give away at the Veterans Committee table for the upcoming Local 862 Resource Fair, a family event for the entire local, but geared towards the Louisville Assembly Plant as they prepare for a temporary layoff for retooling.
- * The Committee received approval to purchase tickets for the annual Be At Ease event, which is a fund raiser for Dogs Helping Heroes.
- * Local 862 Veterans Committee made a donation to Wreaths Across America and assisted Local 3047 Veterans Committee with the event that they were hosting.

Local 1407 (Cookeville, TN)

* The Chair of the Local 1407 Veterans Committee is still trying to get his Committee going. A lack of funds is keeping them from from being able to do anything requiring cash. Suggestions on fund raising ideas have been shared. Also, looking at some volunteer opportunities to get out into the community.
